SEM Committee Decision for the Regulatory Authorities in relation to Mod_12_21 (Final Recommendation FRR_12_21)

Dear Esther,

On 20 July 2021, the Modifications Committee submitted its Final Recommendation Report (FRR) with regard to Modification Proposal Mod_12_21 'Clarification of text regarding the Effective Date of a Modification' in accordance with Paragraph B.17.18.1 of Part B of the SEM Trading and Settlement Code (TSC). The Modification Proposal Mod_12_21 was submitted to the Modifications Committee by the RAs on 14 April 2021 and discussed and voted on at Meeting 105 on 17 June 2021.

This Modification seeks to clarify an existing provision of Section B.17.20.4 of the T&SC regarding the date that modification decisions of the Regulatory Authorities become effective. In advance of becoming effective in the T&SC, modifications often require system changes to be delivered by the Market Operator. These system changes typically occur on a biannual basis. However, the specific release date of these system changes may not yet be known at the time a

modification is approved. In such circumstances it may be inappropriate for the Regulatory Authorities to specify a particular calendar date for the modification to become effective.

This Modification proposes to amend the T&SC in order to make clear that the RAs may specify in their decision on a modification that that modification shall become effective on the first available date following the delivery of the required system changes.

Considering the above, and in accordance with Paragraph B.17.20 of the Code, the SEM Committee direct that a Modification, as set out in Appendix 1 of FRR_12_21, is implemented on a Settlement Day basis with effect from one Working Day after this letter is issued.
